

Anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction that is rapid in onset and may cause death.

Anaphylaxis occurs when there is a progression of symptoms, symptoms in more than one body part or respiratory or circulatory issues.

### FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SEVERE SYMPTOMS



LUNG - Short of breath, wheezing, repetitive cough



**HEART** - Pale, blue, faint, weak pulse, dizzy



**IROAT** - Tight, horse, trouble breathing/swallowing



**MOUTH** - Significant swelling of the lips, mouth or face



**SKIN** - Many hives over body, widespread redness



**GUT** - Repetitive vomiting, severe diarrhea

**OTHER** - Feeling something bad is about to happen, anxiety, confusion

### OR MORE THAN ONE MILD SYMPTOM



NOSE - Itchy/runny nose, sneezing



**MOUTH** - Itchy mouth



**SKIN** - A few hives, mild itch



**GUT** - Mild nausea/discomfort

## **INJECT EPINEPHRINE IMMEDIATELY**

# **CALL 911 - Request an ambulance with epinephrine**

**POSITIONING** - Lay the person flat and raise their legs. If breathing is difficult or they are vomiting, let them sit up or lie on their side.

**NEXT STEPS -** If symptoms do not improve, or symptoms return, more doses of epinephrine can be given about 5 minutes or more after the last dose. Transport to and remain in ER for at least 4 hours because symptoms may return

Do not depend on antihistamines. When in doubt, give epinephrine & call 911
